Understanding and Beating Cancer がんを知って、がんに負けない!

Nowadays in Japan, half of all people will have cancer at some point, and 1 in 3 people will die of it. One half of deaths among people in their 50s are due to cancer. Being young does not necessarily mean that one is safe from cancer. Among the 20-64 age group, the top cancer among men is colorectal, followed by stomach and lung, in that order. For women, the top cancer is breast, followed by uterine and colorectal, also in that order.

The causes of approximately 60% of cancers are lifestyle-related. Smokers and obese people are at an increased risk for cancer. Making changes to one's lifestyle can reduce the risk of cancer. Only 5% of cancers are caused by genetic factors, so a lack of family history of cancer does not make one safe.

Early Detection with Screening

The appearance of cancer symptoms can indicate that cancer is already progressing. Even if you do not show any symptoms, make sure to get tested for cancer.

When getting screened for cancer, you should also undergo yearly tests for other conditions. These tests can provide an impetus to change your lifestyle. Those in their 40s and 50s in particular are recommended to undergo these tests. For your sake and the sake of those you care about, please get tested for cancer.

Applications for Tests and Physical Examinations Due by April 25th

Applications for various tests (including cancer), physical examinations, and MRIs for this fiscal year are now being accepted. Those who are not signed up already should apply. In addition, physical examinations and MRIs require a new application every year. The application deadline for this year is earlier than usual. Applications must be postmarked by April 25th. Application forms can be found with the FY 2014 Family Health Calendar.

Strawberry Daifuku Mochi

- Wash strawberries lightly, remove stems, and dry.
- Cover (1) in bean paste and make into a round shape. If the heads of

Ingredients (serves 2)
Mochi rice flour100g
Sugar25g
Water120~125ml
Strawberries8
White bean paste200g
Flourto dust

- the strawberries peek out slightly from the bean paste, the mochi will gain an attractive red tint when the dough is put on.
- Add flour, sugar, and water (as needed) to a heat-resistant container. Stir lightly then microwave for 3 to 4 minutes.
- 4. Remove from microwave and stir lightly. Microwave for another 2 to 3 minutes, then mix again.
- Put the dough from (4) on a flour-dusted pan. Divide into 8 pieces then place on the strawberries from (2).
 Stretch dough and cover strawberries with it.

Festivals and National Holidays さいじつ・ぎょうじ

Shōwa Day

ロステッカン ひ 昭和の日 April 29th

This holiday celebrates the birthday of the late Emperor Hirohito, who reigned from 1926 to 1989. Following his death in 1989, the holiday was established as Greenery Day in reference to the emperor's love of nature. In 2007, however, Greenery Day became a separate holiday observed on May 4th, and Shōwa Day assumed its present name.

Places to Visit

おもしろいところ

Hanami (Cherry Blossom Viewing)

花見

The end of March and beginning of April are known as the season of pink cherry blossoms. Around this time, many people go out with friends and family in order to observe the beautiful blossoms. This pastime is known as *hanami*. Recommended areas for *hanami* are as follows.

Kyōto Kyōto has many good *hanami* areas, the most famous of which are the Philosopher's Path and Maruyama Park.

The Philosopher's Path is a two-kilometer road between Ginkakuji Temple (Temple of the Silver Pavilion) and Nanzenji Temple. A small river runs along the path, making a leisurely stroll the perfect way to take in the beauty of the cherry blossoms. To get to the Philosopher's Path, take the 5 bus from Kyōto Station and get off at Nanzenji-Eikandōmichi.

Maruyama Park, by contrast, offers a more festive atmosphere. There are many food stalls surrounding the large weeping cherry blossom tree in the center of the park. At nighttime, this tree is illuminated. To get to Maruyama Park, take the 100 or 206 bus from Kyōto Station and get off at Gion.

Nara South of Nara is Mount Yoshino, known for the beauty of its cherry blossoms. With approximately 30,000 cherry blossom trees, it is one of the most famous *hanami* locations in all of Japan and is particularly recommended for those who would like to partake in *hanami* while hiking. To get Mount Yoshino, take the Kintetsu Line to Yoshino Station.

Nara Park, famous for its deer, is also another good *hanami* spot. It has approximately 1,700 cherry blossom trees and is good for people who want a relaxed atmosphere. Nara Park is a 10-minute walk from Kintetsu Nara Station.

Seika There are also good *hanami* locations right here in Seika. The most well-known is the Suikeien in Keihanna Commemorative Park, but Takeuchi Shrine (located north of the Seika Town Office) and Kannonji Temple (located south of Dōshisha University) are also attractive spots.
