Festivals and National Holidays さいじつ・ぎょうじ

Coming of Age Day _{せいじん} 成人の日 January 12th

This holiday celebrates those who have turned 20, the official age of adulthood in Japan. Municipal governments all over the country hold ceremonies featuring speeches from officials, followed by parties. Young women participating in these events often wear extremely elaborate kimono which can take hours to put on. Seika will hold its Coming of Age Ceremony this year at Keihanna Plaza's Main Hall.

Igomori Festival いごもり祭 January 8th – 10th

According to legend, the Igomori Festival was first held around the year AD 770 to ward off an evil spirit bringing plague and famine upon the locals. Nowadays, the festival begins with the lighting of a huge torch after dark at Hōsono Shrine. The flaming torch, which weighs over 75 kilograms, is then paraded through the streets of Seika by six or seven men. Many food vendors set up around the shrine to add to the festive atmosphere. Residents of the area surrounding the shrine also hold a tug of war competition; it is believed that the winning team will be assured of a good harvest for the rest of the year.

Access: (About a 20 min walk)

From Shinhousono/Housono Station East exit follow the road straight (East) until it ends. Then turn left (North). At the first stoplight turn right (East). Follow that road until it ends at the entrance of Housono Shrine.

Setsubun

Although the name of this holiday originally referred to the day before the start of any new season, it has come to describe the festival marking the traditional beginning of spring. This festival is famous for the tradition of mamemaki, or bean throwing, among families. One member of the family dresses up as an oni (demon) while the others throw roasted soybeans at that person and yell, "Oni wa soto! Fuku wa uchi!," meaning "Demons out! Good fortune in!" All of the family members then eat the number of beans corresponding to their respective ages. There will be a Setsubun event at Keihanna Commemorative Park the day before the festival.
