The Health Insurance Card Will be Consolidated to the My Number Insurance Card

After December 2, 2024, The Health Insurance card will be consolidated to the My Number Insurance Card (My Number Card that has been registered for use as an insurance card), and the new issuing and re-issuing of the previous Health Insurance Cards will end.

Transitional Measures

Health Insurance cards that are issued before December 1, 2024 can be used for maximum of 1 year after the date of discontinuation (December 2, 2024). Please do not dispose of the Health Insurance Card until after the expiration date on the card. In addition, the period of transitional measures will differ depending on the health insurance you are enrolled in.

- Those who are enrolled in Seika Town National Health Insurance: Until December 1, 2025
- Those who are enrolled in the Latter-Stage Elderly Healthcare System: Until July, 31, 2025
- Those who are enrolled in their place of employment's health insurance: Please confirm with employers If your card expires prior to the time periods mentioned above, it can only be used until the expiration date. After December 2, 2024, there will be no re-issuing of Health Insurance Cards due to loss, etc. Also, please keep in mind that if you have moved in/out of Seika town before December 1, 2024, there will be no new issuing of cards as well.

Management after Health Insurance Card Discontinuation

For those who have a My Number Insurance Card

A "Notification of Qualifications" will be sent to more easily understand your insured status information. It is possible to receive medical attention when you present both your My Number Insurance Card and Notification of Qualifications at medical institutions that are unable to read My Number Insurance Cards.

For those who do not have a My Number Insurance Card

A "Certificate of Eligibility" document will be sent. It will be sent to recipients without applying for it. Those without a My Number Insurance Card can continue to visit medical institutions by using the Certificate of Eligibility document sent by your insurer.

Town Nursery Schools



Nursery School Admission Acceptance for 2025 Starting December 2 (Mon.)

Admission acceptance for next year April to the municipal nursery schools is occurring from December 2 (Mon.) till December 6 (Fri.). Please thoroughly read the "2025 Nursery School Admission Guidebook" and apply.

Check your Nursery Care Necessity

You can apply to admit your child to nursery school in the situation that, for any of the reasons listed below, the child's parents/legal guardians cannot care for the child during the day.

- O Work
- O Pregnancy/Birth
- O Parent/Guardian's Sickness or Disability
- O Care for a relative that you are living with or is hospitalized for an extended amount of time

*It is possible to continue to use the nursery school if you have a child that needs to continue using nursery school while you are taking child leave. (Not possible for new admittance).

For Children 6 Months & Onward

This time, we are taking applications for children ages 0-5 that are born after April 2, 2019 and are 6 months or older from next year April. The number of applicants for any age is limited. These are the nursery school within Seika Town:

Distribution of Application Forms Starts from November 5 (Tues.)

The application for proof of necessity for childcare, the nursery school admission application form, and the 2025 Nursery School Admission Guidebook, etc. will be distributed to the Childrearing Support Division (Town Hall 2nd Floor) and to every nursery school after November 5 (Tues.) on a weekday. Also, you can download it from the town website's homepage.

Applications for Small-Scale Childcare Facilities

The small-scale childcare facilities "Child Room Hina" (Seikadai Nursery School North side) and "Sumomo-en" (Seika Town Firefighting Headquarters South side) are taking applications for a small number of children.

Any of the facilities are for children ages 0-2. This is childcare for a small number of children, with "Child Room Hina" having a capacity of 9 children, and "Sumomo-en" being 19 children. To apply to use, there are necessary procedure to be accepted. The application form distribution and acceptance place is only at the Childrearing Support Division.

Kyoto Nagaokai Public Welfare Corporation is the main operators of both facilities. The payment of the user's fee amount (Childcare fee) will be to Kyoto Nagaokai.

Acceptance for Admission Halfway Through this Year is Until this Month

Currently, conditions make it difficult to arrange for mid-year admission at every nursery school. As a general rule, after December 1 (Sun.) they are unable to accept mid-year admission. For more details, please contact using the number below.

Also, for those who applied mid-year and were deferred, if you are wishing for admission next year, in order for your necessity for childcare to be accepted, the procedures and application for childcare use are required once again.

Cooking and Health



Let's learn how to make Grilled Eggplant with Grated Okura with this recipe

from Seika Town Diet Improvement Association Asunaro-kai!

Ingredients (Two Servings)

Eggplant	2 (600g)	Itohana Katsuo	To Preference
Okra	6 (60g)	(Marinade) Dashi	150ml
Grated Ginger	20g	Dark Soy Sauce	1 1/2 tsp
		Light Soy Sauce	1 1/2 tsn

Instructions

- 1) Cut and remove the stem of the eggplant, place it on a metal net and grill on high heat.
- 2) Drop the eggplant in cold water, then quickly take it out and peel the skin
- 3) Mix and separate 30ml of the marinated dashi and use the remaining to pickle the eggplant.
- 4) Boil the okra in salt water, drop in cold water and then remove the seeds and any unnecessary parts. Finely chop and then mix with the 30 ml of separated marinade from Step 3.
- 5) Cut the eggplant into easy to eat pieces, and place the okra from Step 4, grated ginger, and itohana katsuo on top.

"Eggplant's Nutritional Value"

A unique nutrient found in eggplant is potassium, which helps to remove excess salt and water from the body, making it effective for protecting against high blood pressure and reducing swelling. It also contains a lot of vegetable fiber that can help prevent constipation and improve stomach conditions. It also works to slow the raising of blood sugar, and reduce the amount of cholesterol in the blood stream, making it helpful in preventing heart attacks, diabetes and other lifestyle diseases.

Review the Basics of the My Number Card! (Individual Number Card)

My Number Card is a plastic IC chip card with a photograph of the person's face used as an identification document, and can also be used in convenience stores, etc. to acquire credential documents like the Proof of Residence, etc. The information printed on the card, and the information (Electronic Certificates) used for official personal identification services that utilize online applications are recorded in the IC chip equipped on the My Number Card. However, personal information like income status and medical history are not recorded.

Communicating Through Sign Language

What is Reasonable Accommodation?

"Reasonable Accommodation" is a term that became widely known after the adoption of the "Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities" at the 2006 United Nations General Assembly. From April 2024, Elimination of Discrimination Against Persons with Disabilities became law, making it required for workplaces to offer Reasonable Accommodation for their employees. What is this "Reasonable Accommodation?" People with disabilities expressed their wish for societal barriers they face to be removed. To remove these barriers, A reasonable response to this was created, to the extent that the responsibility associated with its implementation is not excessive. What is "Reasonable Accommodation" for those who cannot hear, or are hard of hearing? From next issue onward, let's try to consider it.
