Submitted Photo Requirements:

- 1. The applicant must have taken the photo of nature, rural landscape, townscape, scenery, etc. within Seika Town (we will not inquire about when it was taken. Besides present photos, you can also submit nostalgic pictures from the past).
- 2. Please mention the place the photo was taken.
- 3. For digital pictures, one picture must be under 10MB (Under 100MB for all) in JPEG format.
- I. The photos must not be applicable to the following:
 - A violation of public policy
 - ② Submission with the purpose of commercialization such as advertisement, publicity, recruitment, business activities, etc.
 - 3 An infringement on privacy, copyright, or rights to usage of one's likeness.
 - 4 Discriminating/Defamation of another person
 - ⑤ Photos taken in restricted places
 - 6 Other reasons deemed inappropriate by the mayor.

Important Points

- · When the photos are published, the layout, size, etc. is left up to the town.
- · Photos may be cropped and published according to the page of the booklet.
- Photos will be used on pages other than the photography page.
- · All submitted photographs will not necessarily be published. Also, any photos deemed inappropriate by the town cannot be published.


Let's learn how to make **Quick Breakfast Sunny-Side Up Fried Egg Toast** with this recipe from Seika Town Diet Improvement Association Asunaro-kai! Anyone can make this easy-to-make, filling breakfast!

Ingredients (Two Servings)

1 Slice of 6 Slice Cut Bread 2 tsp Mayonnaise 2 tbsp (15g) Melting Cheese 1 Slice Bacon 1 Small-size Egg (40g) A Pinch of Pepper

Instructions

- 1) Place the slice of bread onto aluminum foil, remove the bread crust and make a depression in the middle with your hand.
- 2) Similar to making a frame, rim the edges with mayonnaise.
- 3) Crack an egg on the middle of the bread, break the yolk a little bit, place the 1cm cut bacon and melting cheese on the bread, and sprinkle pepper on top. Bake in the oven toaster for 8-10 minutes. (When it looks like it is about to burn, cover the top with aluminum foil.)

Nutrition Education Tip No. 55

"Why Does the Egg Yolk Color Vary?"
The color of an egg yolk is determined by the eaten feed. When there is a lot of strong yellow-colored grass and corn, the yellow color becomes stronger, and when there is a lot of feed rice and grain sorghum (grain for feed), the yellow color becomes pale. When paprika and crab shell pigment is mixed in the feed, a red color becomes stronger.

National Pension - When You Turn 20

Japan's Public Pension System is a system created with a social insurance way of thinking which supports everyone's livelihood when one retires, when a disability is incurred from an accident, and when a family's financial supporter passes away.

Those living in Japan aged 20-60 become insured in the National Pension and National Pension Plan 1 Insured Persons are required to pay the National Pension Insurance Premium every month.

However, in situations where one's earnings are low and are unable to pay the premium before the payment deadline, it is possible to apply for "Special Exceptions for Student Payments" and "Exception and Determent of Payment," so please consult about this.

The 3 Pension Benefits

It is thought that the pension is only for retirement, however there are benefits that can be received by those still working.

Old-Age Pension

this is a pension-benefit plan that can be received from 65 years old until the end of one's life. This is what is generally thought of as a pension.

Disability Pension


• When a disability remains from a sickness or injury, this disability pension-benefit plan can be received according to the degree of disability.

Survivor's Pension

• This is a pension-benefit plan that can be received by a spouse with children and/or children when the family's financial supporter passes away.

Pension is Generation to Generation Support

Japan's Public Pension System operates based on "Generational to Generation Support," in which the pension is supported by the insurance paid by the current working generation (Taxation System). Also, Japan's Public Pension System is a Two-Storied Structure like the illustration below.



Issuance of Basic Pension Number Notification

In Japan's Public Pension System, a Basic Pension Number is shared and used between all the pension systems, and manages accession records, insurance premium payment status, and more. After April 2022, New Insured Persons under the National Pension Plans 1-3 are issued a "Basic Pension Number Notification" instead of a delivered pension book. It has become required for procedures concerning the pension, so please store it safely. However, a Basic Pension Number Notification is not issued to those who already have a pension book. In addition, pension books can continue to be used as a document to confirm the basic pension number. If lost, a Basic Pension Number Notification will be issued without the reissuance of a pension book.

Pre-register in Person - Prevent Unauthorized Acquisition of

Notifications/Certificate of Residence

You can receive a notification when copies of your family register, certificate of residence and more are acquired by an agent or third-party. This is to prevent unauthorized acquisition and false claims, so it is required to pre-register to receive alerts. This is for those who have their domicile or address registered in the town, and/or those who have registered in the past. Please bring an application form* and Personal Identification Documents (identification issued by public agencies like My Number Card, Driver's License, Health Insurance Card, etc.) to the Service Counter Division (Town Hall 2nd Floor).

Certificates Subject to Notification

 Your official family register/excerpt (All or one part of the certificate), copies of your Certificate of Residence, Supplementary Family Register, etc.

Instances where Notifications will not be Received

- Requests for an official copy of the family register from the person themselves, a person on the same register, lineal ascendant, etc.
- Requests for a Certificate of Residence from people in the same household
- Requests from public institutions like national or regional public organizations
- Requests from lawyers, and judicial clerks to use for court and dispute resolution procedures

Communicating Through Sign Language

Sign language is often referred to as the language you can see. Not all individuals who have hearing disabilities use sign language, but we are introducing it as one way of communicating with these individuals. We hope that sign language will help to raise awareness of hearing disabilities. From November till January, we will receive stores from Soraku Association for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and Seika Town Digest Transcription Circle "Himawari."



⟨ This month's sign language ⟩ January's sign language is "I see," a conversational interjection you use when you understand information. This is even used in sign-language conversation, like "I see."

"I see"



Place the thumb of your right hand on your chin and bend your extended pointer finger towards your thumb 2 times.

What Really is Necessary Accommodation

Reasonable Accommodation is when disabled people express their wish to be helped and are accommodated to the extent that it does not become an excessive responsibility.

Now, let's explain Reasonable Accommodation by the alphabet based on a real-life example. A person who is hard of hearing loses both their hearing aids, so in order to get help finding them they request to communicate by writing with the station employee, however the employee did not communicate by writing. That station employee explained that that person was able to do silent mouthing, so they did not communicate by writing. Even though it is simply called "hard of hearing," the extent of hearing ability and ways of communication is varied from person to person. Reasonable Accommodation would be to match the person in question's desired communication methods, wouldn't it?
