

*Items that cannot be disposed of: Business waste (waste from restaurants, construction, offices or any other waste produced from business activities), tires, car batteries, used oil, fire extinguishers, paint, fertilizers, mulch/weed growth prevention sheets, chemicals, construction waste materials, extremely large or heavy items, recyclable home appliances (air conditioners, televisions, refrigerators, and washing/drying machines), cement blocks, dirt, etc.

*Scrap material and waste from home improvement projects, car maintenance, large tree and yard waste are considered construction or commercial waste and must be disposed of accordingly, as they do not meet the criteria of acceptable waste for garbage collection.

Seika Town Garbage Sorting App

This app has many different convenient features including: a garbage calendar for each area in Seika, a garbage sorting dictionary that can help you to make sure that you are sorting your garbage correctly, and an alert function that will remind you when collection day is. You can download the app by scanning one of the QR codes to the left or by looking up "Seika Town gomi" on the app store.

Please Drain Excess Liquid From Food Scraps

It is said that 70% of food scraps is liquid. Draining excess liquid will allow for the amount of garbage disposed to be significantly reduced.



Draining Liquid

Drain items containing large amounts of liquid by squeezing tightly with your hands. If you do not want to get your hands dirty, you can instead place the food scraps in a net as pictured above and use an old CD to squeeze out excess liquid.

*There is a chance that you may break the CD if you squeeze too hard, so please be careful.

There are also many products sold in stores that can be used to drain excess liquid. Please try and find one that is easiest for you to use. Decreasing the amount of liquid present in food scraps not only decreases the amount of garbage, but also contributes to an increase in the efficiency of waste burning while decreasing the consuption of energy. Additionally, excess liquid present in food scraps can cause garbage bags to smell, especially in the summertime. By draining the excess liquid, you can decrease the likelihood that your garbage will smell and make your garbage bag lighter.
