You may feel uneasy when thinking about this, but rest assured that the Seika Fire Department has a service that you can use during these emergencies. It is a multi-lingual interpretation service. Did you know about it? Seika Town has also implemented the use of this multi-lingual interpretation service so that the foreign resident population can also receive proper aid during emergencies. What you will be asked when you

Have you ever been worried about what to do in the event of a fire or medical emergency?



How to Use the Multi-Lingual	
Interpretation Service	

1. When there is a fire or you need an ambulance. call "119".

2. If it is difficult to describe the situation in Japanese, please first let the operator know which language you would like to have assistance in.

Ex. "English please".

\*If you would like to receive assistance in another language and you cannot say it in Japanese, it is expected that the operator will be able to understand a language name in English, but if your native language is not English the operator may not be able to understand what language you are speaking. Please keep this in mind.

3. Next, the operator will connect the interpretor to the call. This may take a minute or two, so please wait patiently until the interpretor joins the call.



# call "119"

- The address where the ambulance or firetruck should be deployed
  - If you are not sure of the address, tell the operator about any nearby large buildings, intersections, or anything that would be a landmark
  - The name and contact information of the person who called
    - There are occassions where  $\triangleright$ confirmation or questions arise regarding the situation before the firetruck or ambulance arrives after the call with the operator has ended

# **Coronavirus Vaccination Information**

## **Coronavirus Additional Booster Shot Information for 2023**

Individuals age 65 and older or individuals at high risk of severe illness will be able to receive a Coronavirus booster shot starting in the spring of 2023. This round of vaccinations will take place from May to August. There will also be a fall session starting after September. Additionally, individuals age 5 and older who have completed their first series Coronavirus vaccinations will be able to receive a booster shot during the fall.

Group vaccinations in Seika Town will be held according to the details listed below.

## Spring Session (May to August)

## · Eligible Individuals

Individuals who have received their first and second Coronavirus vaccination and also fall under one of the three categories listed below:

1 Age 65 and older

 ${f 2}$  Individuals between the ages of 12 and 65 who have a pre-exisiting condition or are at a high

risk for severe infection

③ Employees of health care facilities, facilities for the elderly or physically disabled, or other welfare facilities

## Fall Session (Following September) • Eligible Individuals

Individuals age 5 and older who have completed their first and second Coronavirus vaccination \*The latest information regarding the distribution of vaccine tickets and other vaccine-related information can be found on the Seika Town website.

## **Omicron Booster Vaccines for Children**

The Omicron vaccine has now been approved for use in children ages 5 to 11 as a booster vaccination. After receiving the Omicron vaccine as a third shot, a vaccine ticket will be sent to the homes of children sequentially once 3 months has passed. For children who have not received their third vaccination, please use the vaccine ticket that you already have.

## Vaccinations for the Fall 2022 Session will End on May 7th

Individuals who have not received the Omicron vaccine during the 2022 fall session and are not eligible to receive a booster shot during the 2023 spring session (healthy individuals between the ages of 12 and 65), should receive a vaccine by May 7th if interested. Those who have not received their first series of Coronavirus will be able to receive a vaccination. Learn how to make delicious Strawberry Jelly with this recipe.

#### Ingredients (4 servings)

Strawberries· · · 200 gramsSugar (use as needed depending on sweetness of strawberries)· · · 25 gramsWater· · · 60 millilitersGelatin Powder· · · 8 grams

#### Instructions

- 1 Wash strawberries and remove excess liquid. Combine with sugar and crush with a masher.
- 2 Add gelatin powder to the water and soak. Put in the microwave and heat on 600 watts for 30 seconds to allow the powder to dissolve.
- 3 Add the dissolved gelatin powder water to the crushed strawberries.
- 4 Put in the refridgerator and wait for the jelly to harden.

The bus stops for the Nara Kotsu Bus and the Seika Kururin Bus will be changed as follows during the cycle race.


## Nara Kotsu Bus Route

Buses traveling east on Seika Oodori will not be able to stop at the following bus stops: Hikari-dai 4 Chome, Hikari-dai 3 Chome, and Keihanna Plaza. Please utilize the bus stops at Hikari-dai 7 Chome or ATR. There will be no disruption to the operation of buses traveling west.

Seika Kururin Bus

The "Keihanna Plaza" stop for buses leaving Yamadagawa Station bound for the west entrance of Hosono Station will be moved to the "ATR" Nara Kotsu bus stop.

#### **Confirm What Documents Needed in Advance**

The documentation needed for procedures done at the town hall service counter related to graduation, looking for a new job, or moving will be different depending on the person. When applying for certification documents at the town hall service counter, make sure to confirm what certificate you need, who you need it for, what information is necessary, and who the documentation needs to be sent to.

Example

Optional informational can be added to residence certificate copies and to certificates listing items in the resident registar.

- Residence Certificate Copy ···· All or part of a household, head of household relationship to each member, nationality, head of family, my number, residence certificate code
- Certificate of Items listed in Resident Registar. All or part of a household, head of household • relationship to each member, previous address, registered domicile, date effective, notification date, reason, my number, residence certificate code
- \*Relatives living at the same address in different families will need to obtain a consent form from the individual when applying for a certificate on their behalf.

#### Certificate Issue Service at Convenience Stores

Individuals in possession of a My Number Card can obtain all types of certificates from an automatic issuing machine or multi-functional copier.

\*A resident certificate code cannot be printed onto documents.

\*Hours available: 6:30 am - 11:00 am, including weekends and holidays (Depending on the hours of each location)

#### Print Certificates at Sun Fresh Supermarket Komada!

You can now print all certificates from the multi-functional copier inside the supermarket. Please try using it!

#### **Moving One-Step Service**

Individuals with a My Number Card can submit a moving out notice through the My Number Portal. Once you have submitted your moving-out notice, you will need to visit the resident help desk at the city or town hall of the place you have relocated to. 




## Communicating Through Sign Language

# Troubles Faced by Deaf Individuals

Hearing impairments are different from other disabilities in the sense that someone cannot tell that someone has a hearing impairment based on their appearance. One of things that individuals with hearing impairments find inconvenient is communicating with staff while shopping or at a restaurant. Before mask wearing became prevelant during the Coronavirus pandemic, orders at restaurants were not correctly taken and misunderstandings occured, but these issues have been escalated due to mask wearing. When communicating with someone with a hearing impairment: take off your mask; enunciate your words clearly and slowly; and use gestures, writing, or pictures that the individual can point at. If you learn to communicate in sign language, you will be able to effectively communicate with individuals with hearing impairments and it will also be extremely helpful to them. A sign language class will be offered starting in May. All individuals interested are encouraged to participate.
