
What are the Barriers Present in Society? Have you thought about what barriers there may be?

Barriers can be described as any inconvenience or trouble that people may have with their body or mind including: the inability to hear, see, walk, or express one's feelings well. There are many barriers like this in society. With that being said, there are many things that can be done to help make everyday life easier for everyone. These may be things that you do not consider very often.

For example, stairs near sidewalks can be climbed by people who can walk by themselves. There are also people who have a hard time climbing stairs which can cause them to become a barrier.

However, if instead the path was a gradual slope, then everyone including: people using wheelchairs, the elderly, people using strollers, small children, pregnant women, and individuals with leg injuries would be able to walk on the path.

Barrier-free toilets make it possible for anyone including: people with disabilities, the elderly, and people with strollers to use the bathroom. Things have become easier for everyone to understand since due to the following being used at stations and on buses: pictures or illustrations, hiragana written in large font, text written in other languages. However, this does not mean that the inconviences or barriers have been eliminated for everyone.

People can help others by communicating what is troubling them, by realizing what may be inconvenient or troublesome for others, and by thinking with others how to solve these issues.

If we are able to do these things, little by little barriers will be eliminated from society and everyone's lives with become easier.

In order to help create a society in which everyone can live peacefully and comfortably, Edogawa Ward in Tokyo has made a picture book called "Wallaby's Restaurant Kuwagadoe's Customers" that can be easily understood by everyone. Coronavirus Fall Vaccinations

Vaccinations given starting in the fall of 2023 (September 20th - March 2024) are for all individuals 6 months and older who have completed their first series of vaccinations (first and second dose), with at least 3 months passing since prior dose.

Vaccination tickets for individuals who have received vaccinations in the spring, were sent out in the middle of September. All other individuals should use the vaccination ticket already in their possession. Vaccinations tickets will not be issued by Seika Town again. If you have lost your vaccination ticket, please submit an application to have it re-issued.

Vaccinations for Children Turning 6 Months

It is necessary for infants ages 6 months to 4 years getting their first series of vaccinations to receive three shots making sure there is time in between each.

As of now, vaccinations will only be offered until March, 31st, 2024. It takes about 3 months to finish the first series of vaccinations, so please keep that in mind.

[First Series Coronavirus Vaccination Intervals]

First Vaccination

Second Vaccination: Wait at least 3 weeks after receiving the first vaccination

Third Vaccination: Wait at least 8 weeks after receiving the second vaccination

Learn how to make delicious Octopus and Chinese Yam Curry Stir-Fry with this recipe.

Ingredients (3 servings)

Boiled Octopus ··· 40 grams
Chinese Yam ··· 20 grams
Broccoli ··· 40 grams
Red Pepper ··· 15 grams
Salad Oil ··· 1 teaspoon

Curry Powder ... 1 teaspoon (2 grams)

Mentsuyu (Noodle Soup Base) Double Concentration 1 teaspoon

Instruction

- 1 Cut the octopus into bite-sized pieces and boil.
- 2 Peel the Chinese yam and cut into bite-sized pieces.
- 3 Separate the broccoli into florets
- 4 Cut the red pepper into bite-sized pieces.
- 5 Add salad oil and the curry powder to a frying pan and heat a little. Add the ingredients from step 1 through 4.
- 6 Remove the pan from heat. Pour the mentsuyu evenly into the pan and mix well.

Nutrition Education Tip No. 42 Fast Facts on Octopuses



Of the 95% of invertebrates that make up earth, octopuses are said to be the smartest. Octopuses have three hearts, one normal and two branchial hearts. The blood flowing from the hearts is blue. They have six arms and two legs and can detach their limbs when running from a predator. The arms and legs of an octupus are not completely controlled by its brain and are in fact independent of it, making the limbs able to move even if cut off from the body. The speed of a fleeing octupus can reach up to 40 kilometers an hour. An octopus is much faster than it looks. Additionally, octopuses know how something tastes just by touching it with its suckers and even though its tentacles are soft and wringgling they even eat animals such as spiny lobster and seagulls.

Register to Receive Notifications "Prevent Improper Aquisition of Documents Such as Residence Certificates"

You can receive a notice if a representative or third party obtains an official copy of your family register or copy of your residence certificate. These notifications are used to prevent improper application or aquisition of documents. To receive these notifications you will need to register in advance. Individuals eligible include those whose registered domicle or address is in Seika Town, as well as individuals who had a Seika Town address prior. Bring the application form* along with personal identification document issued by government office (my number card, driver's license, health insurance card, etc.) to the general service counter on the second floor of the town hall.

- Certificates that Qualify for Notifications
 - Copy/Shortened version of all or part of your official family register, residence certificate, address record, etc.
- Not Eligible for Notifications
 - If you, someone in your family, or relatives apply for a copy of your official family register
 - · If you or one of your family members apply for your residence certificate
 - · If national or municipal government offices submit an application
 - · If a lawyer, judicial clerk, etc. applies for use during a legal trial or dispute

Accepting Appointments for Home Visits for New My Number Card Applications Until the End of February 2024

If you live in Seika Town and would like to apply for a My Number Card, but have difficulty coming to the town hall, a town hall employee can visit your house and complete the application. The face picture needed for the application can also be taken at this time. For those interested in this service, please call to make an appointment.

This month's word is Present!





Face your left palm upward and face your right hand downward while touching your right pointer finger and thumb on your left palm. Move both of your hands outward in this position at the same time.

First Step Toward A Hearing Society in Harmony

Individuals who cannot hear or have a hard time hearing love to talk. Those who have suddenly lost their hearing or are hard of hearing have unstable hearing, so many people communicate while also relying on visual information. If you have something you can write with, write what you want to say. If you do not have anything to write with, it is okay to use gestures or even write in the air. Communication is something that can be done without using speech. It is first important to have an open attitude about communicating with others. If two people have the mindset of wanting to communicate heart to heart then there will be a mutual understanding and from this society is born.

Fall Traditions in Norman

Pumpkin Day is celebrated on October 26th in the United States. To celebrate Pumpkin Day, a pumpkin patch is set up at a church in Norman and residents are invited as a way to create a place for people to come together while also raising money for the church's music program. The pumpkin patch coordinator, Stephen Wurst, said that the pumpkin patch was started in 1991 as a fundraiser for the church's choir, but it now helps to support the entire music program. To Norman residents, this pumpkin patch has become a fall tradition and people who went to the pumpkin patch as kids are now taking their kids. To Stephen, the pumpkin symbolizes harvest and the start of the season that brings communities together. This tradition is held every year for the entire month of October.
