Coronavirus Vaccination Information



Coronavirus Fall Vaccinations

Vaccinations given starting in the fall of 2023 (September 20th - March 2024) are for all individuals 6 months and older who have completed their first series of vaccinations (first and second dose), with at least 3 months passing since prior dose.

Vaccination tickets for individuals who have received vaccinations in the spring, were sent out in the middle of September, 2023. All other individuals should use the vaccination ticket already in their possession. Vaccinations tickets will not be issued by Seika Town again. If you have lost your vaccination ticket, please submit an application to have it re-issued.

Vaccinations for Children Turning 6 Months

It is necessary for infants ages 6 months to 4 years getting their first series of vaccinations to receive three shots making sure there is time in between each.

As of now, vaccinations will only be offered until March, 31st, 2024. It takes about 3 months to finish the first series of vaccinations, so please keep that in mind. Following April 1st, all optional vaccinations will require a fee.

Interval for First Vaccinations for Children 6 months to 4 years

Second Vaccination: Wait at least 3 weeks after receiving the first vaccination

Third Vaccination: Wait at least 8 weeks after receiving the second vaccination

Learn how to make delicious Natto Toast with this recipe.

Ingredients (2 servings)

Bread ... 2 slices (120 grams)
Natto ... 2 packs (80 grams)

Green Onions ··· 10 grams
Melting Cheese ··· 36 grams
Mini Tomato ··· 20 grams

Instruction

- 1 Thicken the natto by mixing together the attached sauce and mustard as well as the cut green onions.
- 2 Put meltable cheese onto the bread and toast in a toaster.
- 3 Put the natto on top of the toasted bread and eat with the mini tomatoes.

Tip: Natto toast is recommended for breakfast. It is easier to consolidate the natto when it has been thickened. Lettuce or parsley can be used in place of green onions. If you do not have bread, the natto can be placed on rice instead to make natto rice. This dish is nutrient rich and will give you a lot of energy.

Natto provides many benefits such as: improving gut health, increasing immunity, preventing blood clots and broken bones, as well as menopause. Natto can be eaten at any time of the day, but it contains the enzyme, nattokinase, which helps to disolve blood clots. It order to get the most benefit from natto to reduce blood clots, it is recommded that it be eaten at night.



Protect the Things that are Important to you from Fires!



Do you know Where to Install Fire Detectors in your home?

Since June 2011 it has been made mandatory for fire detectors to be installed in homes. In Seika Town, it is required that fire detectors be installed in all bedrooms and kitchens. If there is a bedroom on the second floor or higher, it is also required that a fire detector be installed on the ceiling above the stairs.

Inspect Your Fire Detector Regularly!

It is common for fire detectors to be battery powered. The life of these batteries typically lasts about 10 years. There are either buttons or strings attached on the fire detectors for inspection purposes. Peform an inspection of the fire detector on your own to ensure that it will work properly in case of an emergency. If the alarm does not go off during the inspection, replace the batteries or main unit of the fire detector.

More Than 60% of Fire Deaths are Caused by House Fires

During 2022, 30% of all fires in Japan were house fires.

However, about 64% of all deaths caused by fires were in the case of house fires.

Fire detectors are the most effective devices to ensure that you can escape from and alerted of a fire early on.

In Seika Town, there have been cases where fire alarms have alerted people early enough that they were able to prevent the fire from happening.

Install a fire detector in your home to protect yourself, your family, and your possessions during the winter season when many fires occur.

New My Number Card Applications for In-Home

It takes about one month for a My Number Card to be created from the time of application. It is necessary for the applicant to come to the town hall in person to pick up their card, but a My Number Card can also be sent to an applicant's home address via registered mail. [Necessary Items]

- 2. Two Personal Identification Documents (Either a driver's license or passport(1) and a documents containing your name and birthday/ name and address)

This month's word is Otoshidama (New Year's Gift)!









Take the pointer finger of both of your hands and move left and right making sure that one pointer finger is above the other.

Make an ok sign (money) with your right and and put it on the inside of your outstretched left palm.

First Step Toward A Harmous Hearing Society (Second Issue)

When you speak with someone with a hearing impairment what do you do? There are various ways that you can communicate, including: sign language, writing, mouthing words, using gestures, or the internet. Just because you do not know sign language that does not mean that you need to hesistate, make eye contact with the person you are trying to communicate with and greet them with a smile. You can try coveying your feelings by incorporating the following when communicating: writing on a piece of paper or in the air, by mouthing, or using smartphone features or gestures. The most important thing is wanting to communicate and understand. An interaction that starts with an awkward smile can be the start of a genuine interaction.

Norman's New Mural

Oklahoma natives, Tony Thunder and Jose Scott, painted an 18 meter mural called the "Circle of Inclusion" welcoming visitors to the new Norman Development Center. The artists took much inspiration from the past, current, and future vision of Norman in order to paint a mural that accurately represents Norman and its people. There is a part of the mural that contains a tree surrounded by agriculture (wheat) which represents the origin of the name Norman, where 'Norman's Camp' was carved into a tree while the land was being surveyed. There are also grass huts which represent the Wichita Tribes, the first people to live on the land that makes



up Norman today. The hands painted around the center of the mural portray inclusion of all races, genders, creeds, and ages. The paint brush and the circle around the shape of Oklahoma is based off the quote, "You deserve a circle of inclusion and influence, but it's up to you to create it." The red paint on the brush represents the people of Norman, taking this color from the city flag. The goal of the two artists was to include a little bit of everything so that everyone could see a piece of themselves reflected in the mural.

Seika Town has maintained a sister city relationship with Norman, a city in Oklahoma, USA, since 2005, and a friendly relationship through Kyoto Prefecture's sister state connection since 1985. Accessibility Workshop

On Friday, November 10th an Accessibility Workshop was held at Seihoku Elementary School in order for fifth graders to become conscious of how difficulties of the elderly and handicaped are also a problem to them. After the children were given



a talk on accessibility, they were able to experience pushing a wheelchair and observe the accessibility features of nonstep buses. Through this experience, the participating fifth graders were able to understand the importance of proactively reaching out to individuals who need help.
