Coronavirus Vaccination Information



Coronavirus Booster Shot Information for 2023

Individuals age 65 and older or individuals at high risk of severe illness will be able to receive a Coronavirus booster shot starting in spring 2023(May to August).

· Eligible Individuals

Individuals who have received their first and second Coronavirus vaccination and also fall under one of the three categories listed below:

- 1 Age 65 and older
- ② Individuals between the ages of 12 and 65 who have a pre-exisiting condition or are at a high risk for severe infection
- ③ Employees of health care facilities, facilities for the elderly or physically disabled, or other welfare facilities Vaccination Omicron

Time Frame Until the end of August

Even if you do or do not fall under the above categories, a vaccine ticket will be sent to all individuals three months after they have received their Omicron vaccination starting in the beginning of May. If you fall under one of the three categories above and the date and time the group vaccination is not written on your vaccination ticket and you would like to participate in the group vaccination or your vaccination time is written and you would like to reschedule, go to the reservation website and complete the rescheduling procedures or call the Seika Town call center.

Ingredients (2 servings)

Okura ... 40 grams
Chinese Yam ... 50 grams
Mozuku (Edible Seaweed) ... 120 grams
Imitation Crab (Crab Sticks) ... 40 grams
White Rice ... 300 grams



Food Education Tip No. 36

What Causes Okura to be Sticky?

It is caused by the pectin contained in the water soluble dietary fiber. Pectin moves through the intestines slowly, so it helps you to feel full faster. It also helps to keep blood sugar and cholesterol from going too high.



Instructions

- 1 Cut the okura, Chinese yam, and imitation crab into 5 millimeter long strips.
- 2 Put the ingredients from step 1 and the mozuku into a plastic bag and mix. Once done, put on top of rice.
 - ※You can also add Japanese ginger, natto (fermented soybeans), and sprouts.

Register to Receive Notifications ~Prevent Improper Aquisition of Documents Such as Residence Certificates~

You can receive a notice if a representative or third party obtains an official copy of your family register or copy of your residence certificate. These notifications are used to prevent improper application or aquisition of documents. To receive these notifications you will need to register in advance. Individuals eligible include those whose registered domicle or address is in Seika Town, as well as individuals who had a Seika Town address prior. Bring the application form* along with personal identification document issued by government office (my number card, driver's license, health insurance card, etc.) to the general service counter on the second floor of the town hall.

- ► Certificates that Qualify for Notifications
 - Copy/Shortened version of all or part of your official family register, residence certificate, address record, etc.
- Not Eligible for Notifications
 - If you, someone in your family, or relatives apply for a copy of your official family register
 - · If you or one of your family members apply for your residence certificate
 - · If national or municipal government offices submit an application
 - If a lawyer, judicial clerk, etc. applies for use during a legal trial or dispute
- * Application form can be downloaded from the Seika Town website.




Communicating Through Sign Language

Healing Through Dance at Oklahoma University

Starting in 2018, the Oklahoma University School of Dance started offering Dance for Parkinson's classes which were free for people with Parkinson's and their caregivers. Parkinson's disease is a movement disorder affected by a lack of dopamine. This can cause trembling and stiffness of the arms and legs, slowness in movement, and poor balance and coordination. Dancing can help improve motor coordination, balance, muscle strength, and other motor skills while the disease progresses. Participants in the class are able to improve their mobility while also finding a community of individuals going through similar experiences. Kathleen Redwine, an instructor of dance classes at Oklahoma University, says that the program has had a big impact on her, as her husband was also diagnosed with Parkinson's. Through this class, she was able to see improvement not only in her husband's life, but also in the lives of others while sharing her passion.

Full of Excitement at the Kyoto Maker Faire

The "Maker Faire Kyoto 2023", an exhibit and networking event where engineers gathered to display new, never-before-seen technologies, was held at the Keihanna Open Innovation Center (KICK) on Saturday, April 29th and Sunday April 30th and was attended by 5,800 people.

The venue was filled with the works of makers from Japan and all over the world who unveiled their new tools and unique ideas. There was a 2.5-meter tall robot, a demonstration of a device that could be used to control a robot with brain waves, a metaverse experience, and even a booth that used augmented reality (AR) to create virtual flames and beams from hands and beams just like in comic books and movies. Adults and children alike were seen enjoying the event.
