※From 6:30AM on Friday, June 8, only tax declaration certificates and tax-exempt declaration certificates for the 2018 fiscal year (2017 calendar year) will be printable from convenience stores. For all tax certificates for fiscal years before 2017 can be requested from the Town Office.
